### Walks 2022

Men's #91: 20-23 Oct 22 Women's #92: 3-6 Nov 22



At the first Gathering of the year in February, we saw Jim Curtis commissioned as the Community Spiritual Director, Dean Warwick and Trish Dooley commissioned as Walk Lay Directors, Mick Brown and Mark Beresford commissioned as Walk Spiritual Directors for Walks #91 and #92, and Lyn Brown and Mick Brown commissioned as Lay Director and Spiritual Director of Going Fourth #16. A fantastic way to begin the year, and all

topped off with an inspiring 4th Day Talk by Trish Dooley.

Two weeks later we hosted the National Gathering by zoom. About 50 people from Emmaus Communities around the country shared together. Thanks to those people from our Community who organised and ran this event. I have been told the Canberra Monaro Community is leading the way in showing other communities how they still can fellowship together with zoom as an Emmaus community.

The Gathering in March was highlighted by awesome worship led by Henna Watson and Gary Bates, followed by a challenging 4th Day Talk by Dean Warwick and a message from Jim Curtis, both explaining how God can use the tough times in our lives to help us grow in maturity.

It is with disappointment that the next Gathering on April 9th will not be held in Cooma. Due to a range of different reasons, this is not going to be possible. We will aim for a Country Gathering in Cooma in 2023. Therefore our next Gathering will be held at O'Connor Uniting Church, our Bush Capital Headquarters, on April the 9th at 2pm (normal place & time). Like all our Gatherings this year, a Zoom option is available for those who cannot make it in person. This is a great opportunity for our Community Members who live some distance away to join us. I am surprised that more

of our region-based friends don't avail themselves of this option.


The Going Fourth #16 team trained on Saturday, March 19th. Elsewhere in this Newsletter Lyn Brown has provided a report on how preparations are going and we are looking forward to Commissioning the whole team at the April gathering. Don't forget to register for Going Fourth, held on Saturday May 14th at O'Connor - it makes setting up of tables, the room and catering a whole lot easier.

Team selection for Walks #91 & #92 are nearing completion. See a short update in this Newsletter from Dean and Trish on how things are progressing. Training will begin for the ALDs, MDs and WLDs in June, followed by whole Team training beginning in July. We are looking forward to the Walks in October and November. Who are you praying for in preparation for sponsoring on the Walks?

The Board has been looking at how we can encourage our Community to understand the role all of us have in Serving, Agape, Prayer and Sponsorship as part of a Walk. These 4 areas support and uphold the Walk Team (some people call this the "Conference Room Team" but this definition leaves the Prayer Directors in limbo!). The table here illustrates this idea.

## The 4 legs are Serving, Prayer, Sponsorship and Agape.

- "Serving" is not only involved on the Serving Roster in the dining room, but serving also includes setting up, packing away, supplies, etc.
- "Prayer" includes the Prayer Roster, praying over the Pilgrims neck cross, etc.
- "Agape" and "Sponsorship" are pretty clear.



- · The Walk Team is the Table.
- · All four legs and the Walk Team uphold and allow the Emmaus Walk to happen in God's strength.
- Blue text, eg Serving, is the focus item for this time. Each Word or (set of words, eg Walk Team) can be used as a Focus point going forward.


Over time we will be looking at the areas of Agape and Prayer. Sponsorship is important, and we focused on this last year and will touch on it again as well.

# A message from our Community Spiritual Director

What is our calling for the new year ahead?



At my church over the last few weeks we have been looking at the Beatitudes.

[Matt 5:3 - 12] "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

Now I want to share some thoughts on being "Blessed", or as some versions

say, "Happy". The Greek word is Makarios which means "Happy". But this is so much at odds with what we think about when we talk of happiness that we usually use the word "Blessed". Makarios, as well as meaning "Happy", has also connotations of "approved" and "lucky". The advert by AAMI, "Lucky you're with AAMI" kind of captures this. The childless couple looking into a family complaining about the trials of raising their children might well say "You are lucky to have these trials." I look at a couple walking hand in hand, and think to myself, "Lucky man"!

The person, therefore, who is called "blessed" would be called "lucky" by the world. But "blessed" describes the person God approves, because He has given you sovereign mercy. The word "blessed" can be summed up in one word: "Congratulations!" Not that we deserve it—quite the opposite! And yet when God bestows such grace on us, it is as though the angels say, "Congratulations!" We should say to every person born again, to every new believer: "Congratulations!" For not everyone enters into this happiness.

Often, we may not feel blessed and don't much like the pain of trials, but there is a kind of fierce joy or happiness that is only experienced through trial and pain. I have been a rock climber, and it is often painful, but reaching the top of a difficult climb has a special joy and sense of victory, and we often hi-five when we finally make it to the top. In the same way as we experience what Jesus is talking about, there is a fierce joy in knowing that we are on the right track, that our heavenly Father approves, and the angels say "Congratulations".

Paul knew this when he wrote at the end of his life to Timothy (2 Tim 4:7) [6]

"For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time has come for my departure.
[7] I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. [8] Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing."



If you look at each of these beatitudes, Jesus describes those who are happy – blessed. And He turns our idea of happiness and being fortunate on its head. We think happiness is to be rich. Jesus says the happy ones are those who are poor in spirit. We say happiness is not to be sad. Jesus says those who mourn will be happy. We say it is the powerful who are happy. Jesus says is the meek and humble and merciful and those who are peacemakers who are happy. We say it is those who are able to indulge in whatever vice they want and get away with it who are happy. Jesus says it is those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, and who are pure in heart, who are happy. We reckon we are happy when we lead a life where everyone thinks we are wonderful and everyone looks up to us. Jesus says the happy ones are those who are persecuted, reviled and who are insulted and have evil things said against them. Wow, what a difference. In other words, He is looking for those who will die to self, and who will shun temporary happiness in this world, in order to receive eternal happiness in His coming eternal kingdom.

What are your values of happiness, of blessedness? The values of the world – which will only last for a short time, or the values of God – which will last for eternity?





### The Emmaus Library

While helping with the pack-up after a recent Gathering at O'Connor, I noticed a stack of a dozen little booklets in the Store Cupboard (see photo). Firmly secured by a large rubber band, the booklets, published by Upper Room Books (The Emmaus Library), were found to be in very good condition. So, consistent with my new role as Training Officer, I decided to take them home and familiarise myself with the contents. In a nutshell, they are a good resource. Very good in fact. By way of example, the booklet titled "What is Emmaus?" was written by Stephen Bryant, a past International Director of the Walk to Emmaus movement. In it, Stephen answers sixteen basic questions about the Emmaus experience - and he does so in a very accessible style. Each booklet comprises 40 or so pages, and many sections with Stephen's book are headed by a memorable quote or relevant Scripture.

Here is one header that resonated with me, written by a Laywoman from Ohio... "The difference Emmaus makes is seen in the sixty-year-old man who, after his weekend, decides to give up his antique business and enter seminary. Or the woman who was inspired to write a song, praising God in her many local performances. Another example is the doctor who took to adding Bible verses to his prescription sheets to reinforce Christ as the "best medicine."

These books are well worth your time to read, and I heartily commend them to the Walk Teams – particularly the Walk Lay Directors; the Spiritual Directors, and the Music Directors. I've returned the booklets to the Store Cupboard, so, if you would like to read any of them, please do not hesitate to speak with me at one of our Gatherings.
