A message from our Community Spiritual Director

A Visit Announced



It has been announced in Oct by the NSW parliament that King Charles III will visit us, probably in Oct 2024, for it's bicentenary. So, I might ask you; "What does King Charles' visit to us mean for you?"

Possible answers might range from "Nothing" to "Lots". How you answer that question depends on who you are, your position on the monarchy and what possible impact it might have on you and your

life. I have dim memories of going with the family to see Queen Elizabeth as she was driven past the crowds lining Northbourne Ave, with her trademark wave to the crowds. When his Majesty comes, I suppose it will be much the same; some won't do anything at all, some will go out to see him if possible. But for some it will be very significant; there are those whose job it will be to organise and make arrangements, people will have to make his bed, cook breakfast, make security arrangements. Some police might cheer, or curse when they draw extra duties. Our

Governor General David Hurley and his wife Linda will no doubt get to meet him along with a raft of other polies and dignitaries.

And no doubt there will be people who today don't even know he is coming, who will be chosen to meet and maybe even speak with him. I'm thinking of the cute little girls who will be offering bunches of flowers in welcome to their school, or town etc.

Now, let's read of another announcement. From Isaiah 9.

[2] The people who walk in darkness will see a great light. For those who live in a land of deep darkness, a light will shine. ... [6] For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.[7] His government and its peace will never end. He will rule with fairness and justice from the throne of his ancestor David for all eternity. The passionate commitment of the LORD of Heaven's Armies will make this happen!

Now, no doubt when Isaiah made his announcement about a light coming into the darkness of war and invasion of his day, there was just as much variety in the reactions of the people who heard it as there is in Australia today re King Charles visit.

But in the end, there are only two groups of people in Isaiah's world, just as there are only two groups of people in our world. There are those who need this child and those who don't. If you're doing just fine on your own; if you win victory after victory with no trouble at all; if you don't even see the darkness because your future is so bright you need sunnies, maybe the gospel isn't yet for you. Maybe you need to experience the darkness first.

But if you do feel the darkness; if you are weary and need rest; if you mourn and long for comfort; if you feel worthless and wonder if God even cares; if you fail and desire strength; if you sin and need a saviour; this announcement, this light is for you.

Now here is the God bit. When there is a fight looming you want the best fighters and weapons that you can get. But God does not do it like that. He sends a baby and that is not what we expect is it? When you get a baby, it is weak. It can't even hold its head up. A baby is vulnerable, anything can happen, and it will have no defence. So how is it then that God sent a baby into this vicious world? In what universe does that make any sense at all?

But God does not do things the way we think would be smart, indeed God overturns our expectations because God made the world in such a way that weakness overcomes power, foolishness overcomes wisdom and a child defeats all the strength and might of evil.

When everything else in this world fails, when our best plans are found wanting and useless, when we have reached the very end of what we can do, it is then that a child is born to us, it is a baby in the Manger who will set everything right again.

This verse says the government will be upon his shoulders. We might ask of our secular government: "Can we trust the leader?" And by extension we might also ask: "Can we trust Jesus?" and "What kind of government will he bring?" Well, Isaiah tells us. Jesus is and will be forever a "Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

I love what Ray Ortlund says in his commentary on this:

"As the Wonderful Counsellor, he has the best ideas and strategies. Let's follow him.
As the Mighty God, he defeats his enemies easily. Let's hide behind him.
As the Everlasting Father, he loves us endlessly. Let's enjoy him.
As the Prince of Peace, he reconciles us while we are still his enemies. Let's welcome his dominion."

So: Have we allowed the Child-King to take over the government of our lives? Only then can we know the benefits of God with us. We cannot have the light, the honour, the joy, the abundance, the integration that he offers in any other way.

May your Christmas truly be filled with Joy, Peace, and Love.

Walk Reports - Men's Walk #91

I would like to say from the start, what an amazing honour and privilege it was to lead Walk #91. Having had time to reflect on the entire process of training and the Walk weekend, I want to say that even though I was the appointed Lay Director, the success of the weekend is



down to the team and community's dedication to performing their individual roles.

I love the whole Emmaus movement for a whole lot of reasons. The main one being I love watching Men walk in on the Thursday night, often wondering why they are even there and then leaving on Sunday evening, changed men. This happened on Walk #91. Nine phenomenal men arrived, still thinking about what they had left behind. After the New Found Friend activity and watching the DVD, the pilgrims are asked to remove their watches and to place their trust in people they don't know in order to get around. Although this must feel slightly odd, everyone embraced this. The silence is always a powerful time and once again, this was embraced by all.

Without anticipating, Friday morning brought with it a sense of excitement. From the moment table groups were announced, all of the pilgrims launched themselves and listened intently to the talks, discussions, posters, etc. A number of notes were received saying that every table group was gelling well together.

Everyone showed their spirit of acceptance of the program and participated in poster presentations. As Lay Director, I said, "Double points would be awarded for interpretative dance." What a joy it was to see men express themselves through dance!! Everyone went to bed with a sense of joy and hunger of what God was going to do in the coming days.

Saturday morning came around and after enjoying another delicious breakfast that also included "Happy Toast", Pilgrims and Team threw themselves into the activities of the day. Dying moments is always a powerful time of the weekend and Walk #91 was no different. Pilgrims and Team shared openly their individual "Dying Moments" and God arrived in a huge way. Breakthrough was received and Pilgrims and Team's lives were changed. By this time, everyone involved was pressing heavily into God and God was doing what God wanted to do.

After a number of powerful talks and the customary food opportunities, the dinner was phenomenal and the Pilgrims and Team were blown away by the attitude of servanthood by the community. The poster presentations were next level and a level of creative genius was discovered that included play-dough and a standard of dance not seen previously. The ALD skit followed and this was a moment in time that will be remembered for ever.

The next powerful time was Candlelighting. I have had the privilege of witnessing the Candlelighting experience a number of times, and every time I am lost for words. If the team who have experienced this previously are blown away by the experience, I can only imagine how appreciative the pilgrims felt. After returning to Greenhills, the Pilgrims and Team all looked completely blessed by the time.

Sunday rolled around and the Pilgrims all arrived still buzzing from the night before wearing an amazing amount of bling!!. After another breakfast full of deep fried goodness, and a break of about 3 hand widths, Pilgrims and Team converged once again on the Conference room.

There was a small sense of disappointment when the Pilgrims were told that there were no more official opportunities to exhibit their dancing skills, however God was transforming lives. Even though Sunday is a very busy day, by this time the Pilgrims were all forging ahead with new ideas of how to serve their own churches and communities while also dealing with some difficult issues. God was once again providing.

Just when the Pilgrims thought that they had experienced all of the surprises that Emmaus could offer, out came the letters. What a delight it was to be there when men open their letters and break down in tears as they are reminded of the journeys they have been on and how much they are loved. After the letters were read, Pilgrims and Team made their way down to the Conference room and were greeted by the Community. After a small chat from myself, the Pilgrims were asked to share about what the 3 days have meant to them and what they will do about it. All Pilgrims were excited to share about their journey and the changes God has made in their lives. It was so exciting to see how these men have changed and are hungry to see how God will use them during their 4th days.

To wrap up, what an honour it was to share this time with the Pilgrims and to encourage them into their 4th day adventures. I want to finish by sharing some words I shared with the team at the Friday evening team meeting. I believe that these words are relevant to all of us as we go about our day to day lives.

"We are here to create an atmosphere that allows men/women to make themselves vulnerable and to not get in the way of anything God wants to do."
