Satan has been busy trying to disrupt things, but God has been even busier too. The teams are bonding well and some great talks have been presented, by all reports. We need to uphold both teams, praying that God will

protect and strengthen them all and that nothing will prevent all the team members being at the final trainings on August 26th and September 16th.

When are you going to ask that person who you are going to sponsor to go on this year's Walk? Don't procrastinate any longer! The sooner they are asked the sooner they and you can begin preparing. Imagine the Possibilities....

1 Corinthians 12:22-24

"22 On the contrary, it is much truer that the parts of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; 23 and those parts of the body which we consider less honourable, on these we bestow the greater honour, and our less presentable parts become much more presentable, 24 whereas our more presentable parts do not need it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honour to that part which lacked..."

God has made every person uniquely, and to work together cohesively. Some of us can operate in areas others can't. This is because God moulds us into different parts of the body. God gave each of us specific gifts He wants us to use.

Jeremiah 29:11

"For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans for prosperity and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope."

Although these words were written to the Israelites, they can apply to people today. God has plans that are good for you. He wants you

to have a happy and fulfilling life because he loves you.

There is great power in setting goals towards your dreams. And that's true for an individual life as well as it is for an organization such as a church or Emmaus.

Charles Simpson writes, "Exotic fish stores report that sharks have become a popular aquarium fish. Sharks can be six inches long and still be fully matured. Only when set free in the ocean do they grow to their normal length of eight feet. ("Leadership: A Practical Journal for Church Leaders", Winter 1986, p. 40).

We humans are the products of our dreams. Our "aquarium walls" might be fear or shame, expectation or apathy, physical and/or emotional challenges but even the most difficult borders can be overcome by hope. People need big dreams, expansive horizons, large challenges and stretching ambitions. Faith gives birth to the greatest dreams of all.

Matthew 17:20

*"And He *said to them, "Because of your meagre faith; for truly I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you."*

Part of our purpose as followers of Jesus Christ is to have faith in His plans for our lives. When you have this faith in Him, you have security in where your life will go. No matter what happens, when you put your trust in the Lord you know you will be taken care of.

Information about serving in the dining room

What?

- Helping to set up the dining room tables before each meal.
- Greeting pilgrims and team as they enter the dining room.
- Serving tables with drinks, checking in with the people at the tables to see if they need anything, cleaning away the tables as people are finished.
- Cleaning the tables after the meal is finished.
- Serving breakfast, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner and supper.

How long for?

- Serving at breakfast, lunch or dinner takes approximately 1.5 hours each.
- Serving at morning tea, afternoon tea or supper takes approximately 45 minutes each.

Get to know – Gary Barkley



Gary Barkley, Walk #7, Greenhills Canberra.

I am currently serving as part of the Walk #93 team as one of the Assistant Spiritual Directors (ASD).

I am married to Narelle, and we have three adult

children, all married. Nick and Ivonne live near Gladstone in Qld, Joel and Belinda currently live in Canberra (they move regularly) and Kate and Patrick (also) live in Canberra. We have no living grandchildren but have one grand-cat and three grand-dogs.

My favourite food is salted potatoes chips (I know, yours too hey!)

I have a wide range of favourite music from rock, pop, classical and Christian (but not Country and Western – sorry).

My favourite non-work activity is single track mountain bike riding, plus enjoying bike path rides with Narelle.

Both Narelle and I retired from paid work in April 2016 so that we could be free to prepare to serve as Christian cross-cultural workers (missionaries). We joined the Pioneers International mission agency and relocated to the Philippines in September 2018 to live and serve in a rural community on the island of Mindoro.

I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Saviour in 1986 and have always strived to be active in my faith journey. This has included participating in various local Christian courses,

church leadership, children's ministry, Bible studies/small groups, occasional preaching, encouraging others and missions.

After my walk in 1992, I served on many other Canberra-Monaro walks in various roles. When we moved to Darwin in 1998, Narelle and I joined a small Emmaus interest group that later formed the first Top End Emmaus Community Board and conducted our first walks in 1999. This was a great time of serving across local churches and encouraging Christian growth through the Walk to Emmaus weekends and community gatherings.

We returned to Canberra in 2001, and from 2003-05 I was privileged to serve as the Australian National Lay Director to guide and encourage the 23 or so Emmaus Communities across Australia, including the establishment of a few new Communities.

After this my Emmaus involvement slowed and I focused more on Christian mission, serving alongside Narelle in the Philippines both on short-term and long-term mission from 2004, including a combined seven years living in the Philippines.

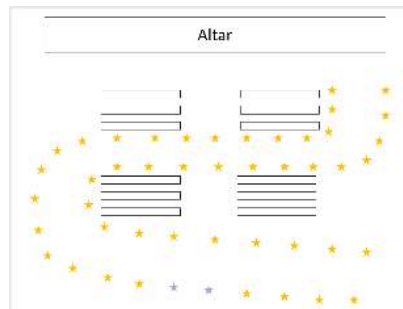
We returned from field mission mid-2022 after living through the COVID pandemic in-country using that time to continue local ministry in our village – we returned to Canberra physically, emotionally, and spiritual tired. Thankfully both our mission agency and church encouraged us to take 9-12 months to rest and refresh, as we also reconnected initially with our family, then our church, and I am now serving on Walk #93.

Face to Face

Face to Face is an adaptation of The Walk to Emmaus. Face to Face is specifically crafted to meet the needs and life-stages of older adults. The program seeks to invite men and women, ages 60 and older to experience Jesus through a four session journey, covering subjects such as discipleship, mission, grief, and end-of-life issues. The highly flexible schedule allows participants the freedom to engage in structured Bible study and prayer in a church setting or other community space. Led by clergy and lay leaders, Face to Face strengthens and renews followers of Christ and bolsters the spiritual life of individuals, families, and congregations everywhere. Face to Face is open to members of any Christian denomination who want to strengthen their spiritual lives, discover answers to their questions about faith, and are open to understanding the responsibility of living a Christian lifestyle.



Face to Face gives seniors the opportunity to rediscover Christ's presence in their lives, to gain fresh understanding of God's transforming grace, and to form friendships that foster their faith after the Face to Face experience. An Emmaus "Walk" in the Face to Face adaptation is known as an "Encounter". The Board has been considering the Face to Face Encounter, which is now being offered to Emmaus Communities to run alongside the Walk to Emmaus. At the National Conference in Toowoomba Andrew and I heard some very positive feedback from some communities that have run Encounters already, and so we are thinking that we might explore the possibility of running a trial one here as well.

We would like to hear from anyone who is interested in hearing more, particularly if you might be available to be part of a feasibility study committee.

Kairos Prison Ministry



Kairos is an independent non-profit ecumenical Christian organisation sharing the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to those in prison. It sprang from the Cursillo movement in 1979 as a desire to develop a prison appropriate version. It is supported by volunteers from 4th day movements such as Walk to Emmaus and Cursillo as well as

volunteers from Christian churches. The current Kairos team going into Goulburn Correctional Centre includes at least six Canberra Monaro Emmaus graduates.

Kairos is a New Testament Greek term that means God's special time. Kairos is about opening that hole in the wall so that God can pour His love in. The first and essential message of Kairos is "God loves you". This love is shown through the Kairos team members. Kairos is not about changing people's beliefs but to listen and love, not to preach and change minds. The motto of Kairos is "Listen, Listen, Love, Love". Kairos is about demonstrating life in the Kingdom so that it is attractive to those who see and hear.

Since establishment in Australia in 1995, Kairos programs have been run in 24 prisons. The ministry is conducted in cooperation with the chaplains in the institutions by teams of laity and clergy who have been selected, trained and then approved by correctional institutions as volunteers.

The teams are drawn from a broad range of denominational churches. For instance, this year's team for Goulburn Correctional Centre consists of people from Roman Catholic, Anglican, Pentecostal, Uniting, Baptist, and Religious Society of Friends (Quaker) churches and is drawn from areas including Goulburn, Canberra, Gunning, Yass, Crookwell, Bundanoon, Bowral, Exeter, Mittagong and Moss Vale.

The key element of Kairos is a week-long Short Course in Christianity. We will be running this in Goulburn at the end of August. The short course consists of carefully coordinated talks, discussions, chapel meditations and music led by a volunteer team. It is useful to think of the short course as a series of carefully planned events that flow from one to another. For the participants, this experience may create the desire to become a Christian, for others it may create a desire to continue their own personal spiritual growth and for others, nothing at all.

At the conclusion of the short course, the participants return to the prison environment, where the Christian community is usually a minority. Many residents soon find themselves missing that deeper fellowship with other Christians, which they enjoyed during the course.

The job of the Kairos volunteer is not to become the primary support person for any resident. We must encourage residents to enter into community with each other rather than ourselves. With that in mind, Kairos teams continue to provide a continuing ministry to the residents through an initial follow up reunion day a few weeks after the short course and then a journey program where the Kairos team visits the institution for a few hours each fortnight.

By engaging in these activities, residents begin to form relationships of trust with each other and with God. The more these relationships grow and strengthen during their time in prison, the easier and more effective will be their rehabilitation and reconciliation with family and the community after release.

You might think to yourself that's all well and good but I wouldn't feel comfortable entering a prison and talking to prisoners – that's not for me. Are there other ways I can support those who are ministering to the prisoners? Yes there are, particularly when the short course is running. There is a great need for the outside Christian Community to show practical agape

love to those in prison through baking biscuits, writing letters and praying at specific times. If you would like to be involved, please send an email to kigoulburn@kairos.org.au. To sign up

for the prayer roster go to Goulburn #24 — Signup Sheet | SignUp.com. Does it make a difference? Let me read to you the testimony of one inmate:

I can never repay Kairos for what it has done for me. I came to the Kairos Short Course filled with hate, anger and deceit. I only came because I heard there would be good food but I didn't want anybody in my face about God. But as I began to hear these men talk about how God loved me so much that He sent Jesus, His own son, to die in my place so that I would be free, something started to happen to me. I began to experience a kind of love that I had never seen or felt before. I now understand that it was the love of God offered to me by His people.

I made a mess of my life and ended up in prison. My family abandoned me and society had written me off. I was worthless and I felt that way. Life had lost all meaning for me – I was like a balloon with nothing inside. But these Kairos men fed me with the Word of God and now I hunger after Him. I will be forever grateful to Kairos for showing me that the way to freedom is through the cross of Christ.
